Principal's Report

May 14th 2020

We had some welcome news on Tuesday morning with the Premier and Minister for Education announcing a return to regular on-site learning in a staged approach for students. A letter was emailed to parents on Tuesday night outlining some further details about the transition back to on-site learning, including a student free day on Monday 25th May (no students at school) with students in Foundation, Grade 1 and Grade 2 returning fulltime from Tuesday 26th May. Students in Grade 3-6 will remain in remote learning until Tuesday 9th June, which is the day after the Queen's birthday long weekend. On site learning for students in Grade 3-6 will continue from now until the 9th June for those students whose



now until the 9th June for those students whose parents are unable to supervise them at home. Further details regarding cleaning, social distancing and movement of people through the school will be sent to parents as it comes to hand. The Department of Education and Training are steadily providing more information to schools to clarify the details around the return to on-site learning for all students.

last Friday. We received lots of photos of students and teachers with their pets, with the highlight being Mr Mowat's pet rock "Igneous". 




Foundation students have been working on What A Good One Looks Like for their reader's notebooks.
