Principal's Report

April 16th 2020

Welcome back to Term 2!! It has been a very different start to the term obviously. I was very pleased with the start we had yesterday to home learning as the vast majority of families were able to connect with their teacher either through Webex or Class Dojo. I have seen media reports last night and this morning, which are claiming yesterday was a disaster, and for some schools and their families, it may have been. I can confidently say we had a really good start, judged on the large percentage of students who were connected to their learning. Students from Grade 3-6 accessed their learning tasks from their respective weebly website which was also terrific. I am aware that there are still a few teething problems with access to the online programs, and at times, internet access is also an issue. I submitted a request on Tuesday for Internet dongles for parents to use as needed and am waiting on advice from the Department about when I should expect to receive them. I know this can be frustrating, but please be patient while we work through these issues. If you are having difficulty at home, please don't hesitate to contact your child's teacher or contact the school office. We are here to help and want remote learning to be a success for all of our students. At times, teachers are finding it difficult to respond to all students in a timely manner and are working at ways to structure feedback and responses to student questions and queries. Again please be patient with this and don't be discouraged, we are here to help. I would also like to thank those families who have provided positive feedback to school staff as this has been well received. We are all in this together and our staff have begun a steep learning curve to change the way they operate as well. They have been busy right through the holiday period and we have had several online staff and team meetings to be as prepared as possible for remote learning. All teachers are trying to provide learning tasks that students are familiar with to reduce the stress on parents in supporting their children at home. One thing that I would like to ask for your support on is trying to make sure your child is using the message system on Webex appropriately. Already there have been a lot of messages sent between students and I ask that you monitor how many messages your child is sending through. Each time a message is sent on Webex, a notification is sent to all other devices connected to that conversation. Sometimes these messages are unnecessary and interfere with the learning of other students, so please monitor the messages your child is sending.




